




Settlement Services

Expressions of interest

Expressions of interest are sought for the 2019-2020 membership on the Intercultural Advisory Committee (IAC).

The IAC exists to provide support, and advise on key cultural and interfaith issues. The Advisory Committee in observance of good practice will reflect the following:

- To facilitate support particularly on the basis of equitable access to Council resources.
- To be a broad-based representation of community groups.
- To provide a forum to articulate issues and needs to ensure better understanding across the community and Council.
- To provide a point of contact for Council to consult and be advised by Culturally and Linguistically Diverse (CALD) communities.
- To build community cohesiveness, inclusivity, social inclusion and promote harmony.

Participation on the Advisory Committee is open (but not limited) to the chairperson, president or manager of local CALD Associations, groups, Committees and relevant State Govt authorities.

Members must be familiar with and adhere to the Terms of Reference of the Intercultural Advisory Committee.

Committee membership is limited, therefore in order to ensure the process is equitable, the City of Ballarat requests that you complete a short Expression of Interest which if required, the Council will use to select successful representatives. We are seeking a diverse mix of community minded people from a variety of backgrounds. Applications from members of Ballarat's cultural community are strongly encouraged.

The IAC will meet bi-monthly (6 times per year, starting in January) at the Ballarat Town Hall, and the tenure of committee membership is for the 2019-2020 calendar years.

The Australian Taxation Office (ATO) as part of their 'Opening Doors' initiative is pleased to offer roles across a number of disciplines (finance, commerce, economics, human resources, information technology, administration and customer service) for professionally qualified individuals from refugee and humanitarian entrant backgrounds seeking to establish themselves in Australia. These are paid, full-time roles in both Sydney and Melbourne with a twelve-month period of maximum duration commencing March 2019.

The following criteria need to be met to be considered for a (work experience) paid employment placement:

- Required to have and provide proof of Australian Citizenship
- Refugee and humanitarian entrant background
- Excellent written and verbal proficiency in English

Successful applicants will need to undergo a stringent probity assessment as follows:

- National Police Check
- Proof of identity documentation
- Professional qualifications (either completed or in the process of completion) in the areas of finance, accounting, commerce, economics, business and information technology are desirable, but not mandatory

The PDP comprises short courses delivered in specialist areas such as: interpreting for health, mental health, education, family violence, and legal settings, as well as interpreter ethics and stress management.

The Victorian Government is inviting applications for its new \$9.5 million Multicultural Community Infrastructure Fund.

Culturally diverse community groups, organisations and regionally based associations are encouraged to apply for projects that build new facilities, improve or restore existing infrastructure, or increase security and improve accessibility for communities.

The new funding stream will offer large and small grants to support projects commencing in the 2018-19 financial year.

This includes an opportunity for community groups to apply for up to \$10,000 towards the purchase or upgrade of depreciating assets such as fridges and microwaves.

VCOSS poverty report 'Every Suburb, Every Town'

Victorian Council of Social Service and economic modelling firm NATSEM have launched a major report and online mapping project on poverty in Victoria.

The analysis estimates there are 774,000 Victorians living in poverty (13.2%), with the poverty rate in regional Victoria (15.1%) higher than in Melbourne (12.6%).
