
Ballarat Welcome Centre

Chinese New Year



BRMC sends best wishes for the Chinese New Year with good health, good luck and happiness throughout 2019.

The Pig is the twelfth of all zodiac animals. According to one myth, the Jade Emperor said the order would be decided by the order in which they arrived to his party. Pig was late because he overslept. Another story says that a wolf destroyed his house. He had to rebuild his home before he could set off. When he arrived, he was the last one and could only take twelfth place.

The Pig is associated with the Earthly Branch (地支 - dì zhī) hài (亥), and the hours 9 - 11 in the night. In terms of yin and yang (阴阳 - yīn yáng), the Pig is yin. In Chinese culture, pigs are the symbol of wealth. Their chubby faces and big ears are signs of fortune as well.



2018-2019 Community Impact Grants Program

Local not-for-profit community organisations are being encouraged to apply for funding through round three of the City of Ballarat 2018-2019 Community Impact Grants program.

The grant program is a great opportunity for community groups to apply for funding for projects, equipment upgrades, community or neighbourhood-based events or even ideas that need an injection of funding to become a reality.

Applications are now open online and close Friday 1st March 2019.

In the first six months of the 2018-2019 program, more than \$110,000 has been granted to 26 local not-for-profit community groups.

Applications now open

The Victorian Government is inviting applications for its new \$9.5 million Multicultural Community Infrastructure Fund.

Culturally diverse community groups, organisations and regionally based associations are encouraged to apply for projects that build new facilities, improve or restore existing infrastructure, or increase security and improve accessibility for communities.

The new funding stream will offer large and small grants to support projects commencing in the 2018-19 financial year.

This includes an opportunity for community groups to apply for up to \$10,000 towards the purchase or upgrade of depreciating assets such as fridges and microwaves.
