



Chairman's Report

Late in 2018 BRMC relocated, from the Sacred Heart Convent in Victoria Street, to the unused Barkly Street Secondary College site. The site is shared with a number of organisations including Ballarat Group Training (BGT) who is the primary leasee of the site. I'm pleased to report that the move has been positive and staff have continued to deliver programs in a seamless manner.

BRMC has secured a lease on the Heritage listed "Former Ballarat East Free Library" located next to the Barkly Street Secondary College site. This building will become the "Ballarat Welcome Centre" and with a grant from the State Government will undertake initial works





BRMC is continuously exploring ways of securing its financial future independent of government funding as much as possible. To enable BRMC to embark on this journey we are currently exploring ways of positioning BRMC to tap into philanthropic and other sources of funding including social enterprises and to support people in our emerging communities to establish their own businesses. To this end BRMC is undertaking a review of its eligibility as a Deductible Gift Recipient (DGR) organisation. BRMC members will soon be appraised of the work that is being undertaken to achieve DGR registration.

BRMC has partnered with the Brotherhood of St Laurence to bring the "Stepping Stones" Program to Ballarat. This is a micro-enterprise program that offers mentoring, training and support to women from refugee, migrant and asylum seeker backgrounds. The program helps participants develop new skills and increase their participation in business and community. This is a 3 year project starting late August.

BRMC is also proud to announce the expansion of the "Interkultura - Friendship through Football" tournament which will take place at the Ballarat Regional Soccer Centre on the 18 - 19th October 2019. We are pleased to have Craig Foster as the patron for the event. There will be 12 teams, comprising players of refugee and asylum seeker background, from across Victoria.





In February 2019 around 100 players from 7 rural, regional and suburban satellite locations participated in a pilot event at Ballarat's premier Regional Soccer Facility. Karen, Hazara, Rohingyan and diverse African ethnic communities were represented. Enthusiastic feedback from participants and multicultural agencies called for an annual regional event.

An enhanced Interkultura Benefit and Community Festival is scheduled for 18 - 19 October 2019. Over 150 players from 12 Victorian emerging ethnic communities will participate. Interkultura October 2019 will offer additional opportunities for girls and young women, community dialogue, youth training, internships and fundraising.


Diversity Homework Club

Stepping Stones to Small Business is a microenterprise program for women from CALD backgrounds as well as those over the age of 50. Stepping Stones builds upon the women's existing strengths by providing education and training about small business in Australia.



Through a suite of culturally-tailored training, workshops, mentoring and holistic support, the program supports women over three years to:

- · Increase their business skills and knowledge of business in Australia;
- · Increase their financial capabilities;
- Enhance their economic and social participation, as well as networks in the wider community; and
- In the last two years, reach key milestones towards establishing a small business.

The program is auspiced by and part of the Brotherhood of St Laurence's (BSL) work to achieve the full social and economic inclusion of refugees in Victoria. It aims to ease the difficulties faced by many refugees who struggle to gain their first local work experience in a new country, despite their qualifications and transferable skills. Refugee Talent offers a digital platform that connects skilled refugees with job opportunities in such a way that benefits both. The philosophy of Refugee Talent is simple: "Gain local experience", "Use your skills" and "Improve your long term prospects".

Refugee Talent assists refugees at various stages in the employment process; reviewing resumes, preparing refugees for interviews, giving local industry insights, matching refugees with businesses and supporting them after the placement.

Preventing the Spread of the Flu
