

Quick Program Updates

Stepping Stones to Small Business

Since 2011, Stepping Stones has supported over 2,000 migrant and refugee women explore topics including finance, marketing and small business regulations through a mix of classroom teaching, seminars and one-to-one learning. Over 500 entrepreneurs (from over 70 different countries) have engaged in business training, with additional business seminars delivered to over 1,600 participants.

2019 saw Stepping Stones expand from metropolitan Melbourne to regional Victoria for the first time, and since August 14 women from across the Central Highlands and as far away as Warrnambool have joined in sharing their ideas and building their skills for developing their own enterprises.





Stepping Stones is looking for women with business backgrounds of their own interested in providing one-on-one mentorship, working closely with a participant once she has completed the course at the end of this year.

Good Governance Program

Apply to be a Good Governance mentor!

Helping community organisations be their best Good Governance helps to create strong, cohesive and more resilient communities by boosting good governance practices in community organisations. The initiative matches trained volunteers skilled in governance with community organisations. These volunteers act as mentors over 12 months, working with the entire committee or board to empower the organisation to develop policies, processes and the culture that facilitate good governance. Through this direct partnership,



mentors can support organisations with the individualised assistance they need to overcome their unique challenges and reach their specific goals. Mentors may support organisations to develop good governance practices in areas such as:

HELPING COMMUNITY ORGANISATIONS BE THEIR BEST

- identifying and minimising risk
- navigating complex reporting and compliance requirements
- ensuring the efficient use of resources
- · evaluating whether or not the group is succeeding
- reducing the social cost of unsustainable organisations
- building organisational capacity
- creating strong, cohesive and resilient communities

How you can make a difference through Good Governance

By sharing your expertise and becoming a mentor, you have an opportunity to help contribute to local organisations, shape your community, and enhance your own professional skills. Full training and support is provided for all mentors, and there is also a Community of Practice available for mentors to further develop their networks and professional learning.

Migration and Settlement Services

Settlement Services this year have included 47 individual client support sessions for 20 client services and 96 swimming lessons for 15 participants. School visits and presentations on culture and anti-racism provided information to 597 students at 7 schools and 40 Diversity Homework Club sessions supporting 129 participants.

The Victorian Government's Multicultural Community Infrastructure Fund (MCIF) is now open.

The program aims to support Victoria's diverse communities to feel connected with their traditional culture and identity by increasing the safety, accessibility and condition of existing community facilities.

Grants of \$10,000 - \$100,000 are available for the practical things that really make a difference to your organisation's efforts to support diversity, such as kitchens, bathrooms, showers, toilets, gardens, offices, floors and even solar panels.

Indian Community Infrastructure Fund

Victoria is proudly home to nearly 170,000 people of Indian heritage, making it the largest Indian community in Australia. In 2018, the Victorian Government committed to further invest in improving and enhancing the facilities Indian communities use to gather, celebrate and share their traditions.



The Indian Community Infrastructure Fund (ICIF) will support local community infrastructure projects that help maintain, upgrade, renovate and construct facilities used by Victoria's Indian communities. Grants range from \$10,000 – \$500,000.
