## Lunorphare 'Luna' Folly Youth Officer, BRMC Executive Committee

Luna is our BRMC Board youth representative. He is also an active member of the Ballarat African Association Board, Interkultura Football Tournament Steering Group and is employed by Centre for Multicultural Youth as a youth advisor and community engagement worker.

Lunorphare Kodjo Folly was born in Benin, in a small village called Ouidah in West Africa. He moved to Australia from a refugee camp in May 2008 with his mother and 5 siblings.



After moving to Australia he attended ESL, a class to help improve his ability to learn English. After gaining confidence in the ESL program he enrolled at Macarthur St Primary School. A year later he moved to Redan Primary School (now known as Phoenix College).

Luna started playing soccer for Ballarat Red Devils and later joined the under 13 squad at Vic Park FC, where he won several club awards. He then moved on to play for Ballarat City FC which played in the National Premier League in Victoria.

With his keen interest to work in the sports sector, he attended and completed the SEDA College Sports Development Program. While at SEDA he went on placement

at the Centre for Multicultural Youth. After placement at CMY Luna was offered a casual position as a Youth Facilitator and has been part of some amazing projects such as Rock the Block, Young Men's Group, Happy Place and Interkultura, just to name a few.

Now Luna plays for the Sebastopol Vikings and coaches their under 15 junior team. As a gifted athlete and football player, he is passionate about encouraging and including young people in sports and community opportunities, especially through the world game. After recently turning 20, he is excited to see life resume back to normal from what has been a difficult and challenging time for us all during this pandemic.

Our Stepping Stones introductory Mentor - Mentee meetings are currently being scheduled. Over the next few weeks each Stepping Stones graduate and her designated Mentor will be sitting down to begin planning what aspects of the graduates' developing business the partners will focus on.

Wherever possible, we will meet in person - and where distance or circumstance prevent that, we will meet virtually via Zoom.

This next phase of the Stepping Stones journey is critical one. While on-the-ground

business activity and customer contact may be restricted, this is still a good time for emerging entrepreneurs to work on their business: Refining their business plan, re-visiting the short and long-term goals that will help make their business more viable, and finding ways to upgrade the skills they need to successfully run their business.



Having a Mentor at their side through all of this provides our graduates a guiding hand and sounding board to help them navigate some of the uncertainties of these times, and to continue to build toward the future.

### **Lodging Your First Tax Return?**

Is this your first tax return or are you new to Australia? The Australian Taxation Office (ATO) can help you with your first tax time.

Your tax return tells the ATO whether you need to pay extra tax (a tax bill) or if you'll get money back (a tax refund). In your tax return you need to include your income and any deductions you are claiming.
