COVID-19 UPDATE

Victoria is moving through a new wave of COVID-19, and numbers are on the rise.

Please help us to help your communities, by communicating the following to them in your language.

Six steps to protect our community

#1 Masks	Wear a quality mask to protect from COVID
#2 Ventilation	Have fresh air when gathering indoors (or go outside!)
#3 Isolation	Stay home if unwell
#4 Testing	Take a RAT if you have symptoms, PCR if high risk
#5 Medication	Consult your doctor immediately if positive and high risk
#6 Vaccination	If you're due for your third or fourth dose, get it NOW!

Please know that if you or you know someone aged 70+, you should act fast

Test quickly if any symptoms arise (PCR is the best option), and contact your GP immediately if your result is positive, so you can begin anti-viral medication asap. Most effective within 24 hours.

UPDATES FROM BRMC

Refugee Experience in Australia Study

Seeking Participation in the **Refugee Experience in Australia Study**. The Scanlon Foundation Research Institute and Social Research Centre are conducting the “Refugee Experience in Australia Study”, researching refugee and humanitarian entrants’ experiences of integration and belonging in Australia to plan settlement and integration services and address any gaps in the future.

The 15-minute survey is for people with a refugee and humanitarian visa and their families (who are over 18; arrived in Australia after 2011 and have permanent residence). The survey (including translated versions) can be accessed in the link below until 23 December:

SCOA launches Road to Belonging and reappoints BRMC CEO, Ann Foley to the Board

The Road to Belonging is a Collective Strategy for Australian Settlement Services- SCOA, that was launched last month at SCOA's Annual General Meeting Dinner by Hon. Andrew Giles MP, Minister for Immigration, Citizenship and Multicultural Affairs.

The strategy outlines the gold standard for settlement in Australia and provides a practical roadmap for the Australian settlement sector to bolster the country's capacity for a more seamless, equitable, and prosperous system for migrants and the Australian population.

A collective of Australia's leading migration and settlement groups has committed to join SCOA in an ambitious five-year strategy to further strengthen the settlement experience for our country's newest arrivals as the government sets to increase the migration cap and cut visa waiting times.



And in exciting news, Ann Foley- Our BRMC Chief Executive Officer, has been reappointed to the Board of SCOA.

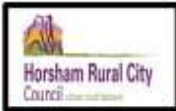

7. Mental health

In My Voice - brief film clips that share insights on DFV from migrant women leaders

November 25th is the International Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women and the beginning of 16 Days of Activism Against Gender-Based Violence (GBV) - an international campaign to address violence against women and girls.

SSI is sharing our 'In My Voice' promotional campaign to help spread awareness and create an impact on ending Gender Based Violence.

The 'In My Voice' campaign consists of six brief (4 minutes on average) film clips that illuminate different aspects of DFV, shared by women leaders from different migrant communities - Africa, South East Asia, East Asia, South Asia, Middle East and Regional Australia.

This campaign hopes to spark conversations, encourage understanding and contribute to change.
